From the Headmaster - Neil Tomlin OBE

As I write, we have only 8 members of the 450-strong Hall Grove community self-isolating having recorded positive PCR test results. This is significantly fewer than many other schools for which we consider ourselves extremely fortunate. We remain vigilant. We realise that our situation could change quickly, which is why we will continue to air classrooms, insist on hand washing, and operate as Section Groups as much as possible. We are grateful for the diligence and support we have received from across our community to ensure cases remain as low as possible so that children can remain in school. Our covid response co-ordinator, Mrs Suzie Brown, has been rock solid throughout this and I feel that our clear message throughout the pandemic has been built on her exceptional hard work. Thank you, Suzie.

Yesterday was a magical day for Hall Grove. Year 2's Assembly, 'The Bee Musical', was exceptional with the delivery of a very important message about the value that Bees have in nature. The children delivered their lines with clarity and accuracy and they all danced and sang their hearts out. Yesterday was also memorable for our Seniors who attended a lecture by Olympic Modern Pentathlon Gold Medalist, Kate French. Kate won gold at Tokyo 2020 and gave our Seniors an inspiring tale of her progression from Pony Club to Olympic Champion. She explained that hard work, a clear aim, determination, and the drive to never give up, have been the ingredients for success. The next lecture in the series will be delivered by members of the Parachute Regiment who supported the recent evacuation from Kabul. The lecture will take place at 6pm on Thursday 11th November.

Huge congratulations to Mr White whose smelting demonstration was a success with the only casualty being Mrs White's hairdryer! The class are delighted with their new axe. On the sporting front, congratulations to Nina Ferreira who has been selected to represent Surrey in U13 Netball.

We are very grateful to those parents of Year 6 children who were able to give up some time this week to help deliver the final part of our Year 6 Senior Schools Interview preparation phase. The interview practice is already paying off with many Senior Schools contacting me to express how much they have enjoyed meeting their Hall Grove candidates. For wider information, we are currently speaking to a few schools to ask if they would like to join us for an evening, in November, to set up displays and speak to our parents. As soon as we have managed to gather a critical mass we will publish the date.

During next week we will remind ourselves of, and will study, our 6th and final school value: be polite and thoughtful. It is appropriate therefore that we layer that value on to our continued study of Black History Month and of Anti-Slavery. We also start our first in the series of Parents' evenings which we are eager should remain face-to-face discussions with our staff. I hope that the value in that is clear. We will also dedicate Friday to our final Autumn Open Day and our Harvest celebrations.
