

# CURRICULUM NOTES – 2020 / 2021 YEAR 4

#### Homework

Children are encouraged to practise their times tables each night to support their classwork; we also have specific Maths homework on a Wednesday, which will be sent home to support what is being taught in class. We ask for this work to be completed and handed in the following Monday. Occasionally, incomplete class work may also be sent home. We also strongly encourage the children to read each night with parent supervision. Spelling will be set weekly; a list of the spellings to be practiced will be stuck in their diary. Any homework or notes about trips etc will be noted in their school diary.

## Summer Term Trip to Battisborough House

Parents will be invited to a meeting to discuss the forthcoming residential trip which will hopefully take place in May.

#### Curriculum

Year 4 finds the children building on the foundations laid down in Year 3. Skills and concepts in each subject are consolidated and new ones are introduced and developed mainly in accordance with the new National Curriculum requirements for Key Stage 2.

As the year progresses, the children should be aiming to concentrate their efforts more fully on the task in hand so that they develop a sense of pride in their work, as well as a determination to achieve their personal best. These skills combine to help them develop a more independent approach.

Year 4 aims to encourage the development of a cohesive and supportive year group, and the field trip contributes to this team building theme through shared experiences as they live and work together away from home for the first time.
