## Groove at the Grove - Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> July

It's turning into the perfect evening - the forecast for Saturday is 22°, there's no clash with any major football match and everything is ready to go. Gates open at 1700 as does the beer tent, the Domino's Pizza stand and merchandising tent. Domino's pizzas will be available all evening -  $\pounds$ 1 a slice or  $\pounds$ 8 for a whole large pizza.
