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The Parents' Briefings all went very well and we received very positive feed-back from a number of parents. If any family did not receive the detailed curriculum notes, please let us know. One issue that came up in the Year 1 meeting was the use of the climbing equipment opposite TASC. Parents are asked to respect the notices attached to the frame and not allow their children to play on it unless there is supervision from one of the Hall Grove staff members. (Further information below.)

Years 6, 7 and 8 parents are reminded that we now have a more flexible finish to the school day with a supervised prep session offered until 1815. You are asked to email the School Office on the days you wish to use this service. A staggered end to the school day should reduce the traffic on the drive at the 1730 collection. We are looking to see whether we can offer a similar service for Pre-Prep and Middle School parents.

In the mornings, parents may park on the tennis courts if there are no temporary parking spaces available (please be aware that tennis lessons start at 0850 on Wednesday and Thursday mornings). Children can then use the marked crossing to walk up the brick path to school. This should ease the flow of traffic a little and prevent the backing up of cars onto the main road.

Climbing Frame

The reason for restricting the use is one of safety and responsibility. Some years ago a pupil suffered a severe fracture by falling from a similar frame in the school garden, and unfortunately experience now indicates that we cannot rely on parental supervision. The equipment is in frequent use at school play times and by TASC, but we regret that it cannot be used for free access.

Building Works

There will shortly be a digger working on site making a temporary vehicle access to the back lawns in preparation for our next construction project. More information about the new extension will follow.

Year 7 Battisborough Field Trip

A big thank you to all Year 7 parents for returning the confirmation slips so promptly. On the morning of departure, the minibuses will be at the top of the drive in front of the main house, ready for us to load up as children are dropped off at their usual time. A reminder to parents that the children are to pack using their sports bag and a small day sack for trips out. There will be a medical container in the front of one of the minibuses so could we ask that parents direct any medication, in a clearly labelled bag, to Mrs Lewis who will place it directly into the container. Any asthma inhalers should stay with your child. On our return on Friday, we aim to have pupils back at Hall Grove in time for their normal evening collection. Please note that all packed lunches and snacks will be provided by the school and there is no need for pupils to bring any food. Please be aware that mobile phones, electronic games, sweets and drinks are strictly forbidden.

Year 2 Sports Programme

The Sports Programme for Year 2 is co-educational and will run as follows:

Games Lessons	Spring Term:	Football and hockey Netball and rugby Rounders, athletics and cricket
PE Lessons	Spring Term:	Spatial awareness, hand-eye co-ordination and foot-eye co-ordination Gymnastics and movement Tennis and swimming.

Year 2 wear football boots for both football and rugby. Initially this term trainers were worn as the ground was hard but, since we have had some rain, football boots can be used. The boots can have moulded studs, metal studs or plastic studs provided that they are kitemarked (this criterion is governed by rugby rules which have strict regulations on studs). We recommend the aluminium rugby studs as they can be used for both football and rugby. Boots can be lace up or velcro, although velcro is easier for the children to put on themselves. Astro shoes may be worn instead of football boots. Shinpads are required for both football and hockey.

Mouthguards are required for hockey and are advisable in rugby although not compulsory as the rugby we will be playing is non-contact. Mouthguards can be purchased from a sports shop, supplied and fitted by your child's own dentist or supplied and fitted by OPRO. Please find enclosed with this newsletter mouthguard information relating to OPRO's forthcoming visit (see Mouthguard Fitting article above).

International Optimist Class Association National Championships 2010

Piers Nicholls (Year 5) competed in the Optimist Nationals over the Summer holidays held at the Weymouth and Portland National Sailing Academy, the venue for the sailing in the 2012 Olympics.
