Last week the school's accreditation for the Investors in People award was reviewed. We were delighted to be told in a highly complimentary report that we were judged to have exceeded the standard. Our thanks to all the staff and the senior managers who took part in the interviews. We are now awaiting our next short-notice ISI educational inspection which we can expect any day now.
