Matrons' Notes

London to Paris in 24 Hours - Thank You

George Langley (husband of Mrs Langley - 1DL) took part in the team cycling challenge for 2010. The concept is that two-man teams in a field of 200 riders cycle 300 miles from London to Paris in 24 hours. It is not a race, but rather a supported endurance relay. The route is broken down into 35 mile/2 hour stages, with one rider on and one off. Each team member cycles at least 200 miles each in 24 hours!

Unfortunately, George's team mate was injured and unable to cycle his portion of the stages. This left George with only one option which was to cycle the entire event by himself. The Challenge started at 0800 on Friday 23rd July in Blackheath and he was under the Eiffel Tower 23 hours 23 minutes later! George and everyone at Scope would like to thank all the Hall Grove parents and staff who made donations or sponsored him through the Scope or Virginmoneygiving websites. He was personally able to raise £,1,175 and Scope raised a total of £,140,000 from the event!
