We were given just one week's notice of the visit! There were a very large number of detailed regulations to check. The pupils deserve much credit for the way that they conducted themselves; all of the Inspectors said how impressed they were with their intelligence, good manners and general interest. We are also very grateful that a large number of parents wrote in and gave their views. Our congratulations to all the staff and pupils for coming through the process so well.
