Cricket Kit

Years 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 may bring cricket bats into school next term (please make sure bats are clearly named). They will be stored as directed by the games staff. **Children are allowed to bring in cricket bags on match days only**. Please be aware that the school supplies all necessary cricket equipment so there is nothing that a child will need that is not provided; however, they may use their own kit on match day if they wish. Years 2 and 3 will not be required to bring bats or kit at any point during the term.

Buying the Right Cricket Bat

Cricket bats can be expensive items and the wrong weight choice can actually mean that your child's batting regresses rather than improves over the season. If you are buying a bat over the holidays, please make sure that you are confident that any advice you are given is sound. As we all know, the quality of in-store advice from the larger sports chain stores can vary enormously. If in doubt, wait until the start of the season and consult one of several well-qualified cricket coaches that we are lucky to have on the staff here at Hall Grove.

The children will be swimming as part of the PE programme in the Summer term. All children in Years 3 to 5 must have a Hall Grove swimming costume (see uniform list).
