## Summer Concert - Monday 4<sup>th</sup> July

The Hall Grove Choir, Girls' Choir and all instrumental ensembles will be taking part. The concert should last a little over an hour. #### How to Remember Absolutely Everything! - Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> July

Parents may be aware that earlier this year Andy Salmon from Thinkalink (aka Sir Linkalot) presented at the school, sowing the seed of linking amongst the children (and teachers!) with great results. They thoroughly enjoyed it and walked away having armed themselves with an innovative twist on an underused learning tool.

The book 'Think-Of-A-Link! How To Remember Absolutely Everything', published by Scholastic Children's Books, is now out on the market costing £6.99 and fits in with Scholastic's ethos which is to make learning fun, very much like their extremely successful 'Horrible Histories' titles. It contains 'links' (and cartoons, where appropriate) for all sorts of key facts like historical dates, the meaning of words, Kings and Queens, spelling, world capitals, Maths times tables, grammatical errors, French words and, of course, the first 10 'Mr Men' books! It also includes Sir Linkalot's 'Tips and Tricks' throughout the book about how to link. There are lots of links submitted by children and grown-ups with their name under the link. Even though the book is officially targeting the children, many adults have said that they have plonked an extra copy in the loo as it is that classic 'dip into for five minutes' read. It is also very much a reference book for when you need to remember a fact you have just heard. If you would like to purchase one then do please let the school know. We can then get Sir Linkalot to sign your child's book when he comes in on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> July.

At 1600 on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> July (the same day as the book-signing), Andy will give a one hour presentation to the parents about an idea he has to start a special club at Hall Grove. There will be a Q&A session at the end. All are very welcome to attend.
