The evenings will begin at 1815 with an informal social gathering in the garden alongside New Hall over drinks (indoors if wet). Parents should not bring children to school for the meetings. Individual parent-teacher consultations have been arranged for later in the Autumn term.

## **Twilight Sessions**

Twilight sessions are available for Years 6, 7 and 8 at the end of the school day to give more flexibility to parents. The children can stay on for a supervised prep or for some outdoor play with the boarders up until 1745. There will be no additional charge and children can be booked in for sessions through the School Office.

### After School Clubs

After School Clubs information was sent out this week. Club lists are in the process of being finalised and parents will be notified if a requested place is not available due to a particular club being over-subscribed. The clubs start on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September and run until Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December, inclusive, with the exception of the Chelsea Football Club which starts on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> September (the week stated in their literature).

### **Music Department**

All pupils who were Choristers last term will remain in the Choristers' Choir; additional Choristers will be recruited over the coming weeks. There will be three rehearsals each week, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. The first Choristers' rehearsal will begin at 0800 on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> September, Hall Grove Choir will commence on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> September at 0800, and the Girls' Choir on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> September at 1245. Participation in Hall Grove Choir and the Girls' Choir is open to anyone wishing to join and any interested pupils should let Mr Heffer know.

Some instrumental lessons began this week, with the remainder commencing next week; please ensure children bring their instrument and all necessary paraphernalia on the correct day. All of the instrumental ensembles will start in the week commencing Monday 12<sup>th</sup> September. A full rehearsal schedule is displayed on several noticeboards around the school. These can be found outside the Clanwilliam Room, to the left of the archway and in the corridor near the staffroom.

If your child is new to the school, it would be very useful to have details of instruments they can play, any grades taken and any groups they may play in outside of school. ### Sports Staffing Structure

Mrs Lomas is the acting Head of Girls' Games, assisted primarily by Mrs Tilley, Mrs Maxfield and Mrs Carmichael. The girls will begin the year with netball fixtures, before switching to hockey from the end of November which continues throughout the Spring term. During the netball season, Mrs Maxfield will take the 1<sup>st</sup> VII, Mrs Carmichael the U11s, Mrs Tilley U10s, Mrs Lomas U9s and Mrs Maxfield U8s. Miss Furness and Miss Dowse will assist where required on match days.

Mr Joll is the Head of Boys' Games. Football is the main sport for boys until half term. Mr Tomlinson is the senior football coach (1<sup>st</sup> XI), and the other coaches are Mr Joll (2<sup>nd</sup> XI), Mr Marland (3<sup>rd</sup> XI) and Mr Lewis (4<sup>th</sup> XI). The U11s (Colts) are shared between Mr Tullett, Mr Adams and Mr Wilkins; the U10s between Mr Towler, Mr Heanley and Mrs Lavery; the U9s are coached by Mr Tullett and Mr Marland; the U8s by Mr Tomlinson and Mr Joll. In addition, the Chelsea coaches are working across all age groups and abilities.

If parents wish to discuss team selections and other such issues please, in the first instance, speak to the team coach and then to Mr Joll (boys) or Mrs Lomas (girls).

Please note that boys and girls are expected to be available for all weekend inter-school matches. Written permission for weekend absence from a school match must be obtained from Mr Tullett, the Director of Sport, or the Headmaster at least a week prior to the fixture. If ill on the day of a Saturday fixture please telephone the Sports Office (01276 470009) by 0900 at the very latest.

## School Travel Policy - Away Matches

Please note that, whenever possible, we like players to travel with their teams to and from away fixtures. We are aware that there may be occasions when a parent would wish to take their child directly home after the match. We would ask that, for weekday matches, prior permission is obtained via the School Office. If there are timetable commitments at school following the match the players must return with their teams.

OPRO, the dental organisation that specialises in mouthguards, will be conducting mouthguard fittings at Hall Grove on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September and Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> September. The forms, which were sent out during the holidays, need to be returned to OPRO if you wish to obtain from them a mouthguard for your child/children. Additional forms are available from the School Office. Please be aware that every child from Year 3 upwards must have a mouthguard in school, whether it be one purchased from a sports shop, one supplied and fitted by their own dentist or one supplied and fitted by OPRO.

### **Golf News**

During the holidays, Zac Jenkins (Year 7) and Xavier Schwarz (Year 6) played in the Stowe Putter. Zac scored 51 points and won the U12 category. He finished  $3^{rd}$  overall in the main event just three points behind the winner and one point off  $2^{nd}$  place. Xavier scored 41 points and won the U11 Junior Jigger. The boys performed really well and both received a silver plate for their achievements.

Zac also recently competed in the Loretto School Scottish Boys and Girls U14 Championship in Aberdour. It is the national event in Scotland for children under the age of 14. The handicap balloted at 12.8 this year, so a really strong field. Zac won the Gibson trophy, which is awarded to the leading U12 player, and crowned the U12 champion.
