## **'My Trip to Wellington' by Thomas Hazell (Year 6)**

On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> October, fifteen Hall Grove students went to the 'Chemistry Spectacular' at Wellington College. All sorts of bamboozling tricks were performed using many elements, from exploding balloons to dry ice - there was something for everyone! Hall Grove's own Troy Walker aided the experiments by having fairy bubbles (containing hydrogen and oxygen) 'blown up' on his own hand (you'll have to ask Troy what it felt like!). My favourite experiment was the liquid nitrogen banana hammer in which a banana was dipped in liquid nitrogen. It was then used to hammer a nail into chipboard! In another experiment, on the hotter end of the scale, iron was made. The container, in which there were several elements, was heated to over 2000°C. When it was hot enough, the cap on the bottom melted and molten iron poured out. Overall, I think this was a brilliant trip and, given the chance, I would definitely do it again.
