#### **Christmas Charities**

Meningitis Research Foundation: a national registered charity whose vision is a world free from meningitis and septicaemia. The foundation is fighting death and disability from these diseases, and supports people affected by them.

Over the Wall: a national charity providing free activity camps to children aged 8 - 17 who are affected by serious or life-limiting illnesses. The camps are designed to foster coping, resilience, self-esteem and confidence.
