*This week saw the felling of one of Hall Grove's finest trees, an enormous London Plane at the far end of the garden that had succumbed to fungus attack and reached a dangerous state of decay. The team of woodmen were assisted by an enormous crane as the giant was taken down limb by limb. The tree was almost certainly planted in 1769 when the house was built; what history it has seen in the years that have followed. Whilst there is now a huge gap in the skyline, space has been opened up for new horticultural opportunities.*
