Outings

This week Year 4 have been enjoying the best of the country's weather in Devon, Year 1 went to the zoo and Year 8 toured Windsor Castle and St. George's Chapel. We also had a big expedition to the Olympic Park (see below).

Olympic Park - Hockey Matches

Yesterday, seventy Hall Grove pupils from Years 6 to 8 and some staff and parents made the journey to East London to watch an afternoon of hockey at the Olympic Park. It was part of the 'London Prepares' series and a chance for the London 2012 Organising Committee to test operations ahead of the Olympics this Summer. It was the perfect opportunity for the pupils to go and watch some international hockey and see the Olympic Park first hand. The first game featured current world champions Australia against Germany, who are ranked number two in the world. It was a thrilling game and Germany ended up winning 3-2. After a short break and a chance to buy some souvenirs, the children saw Great Britain take on India in a highly entertaining game which Great Britain won 4-2. All the children should be congratulated not only on their excellent behaviour, but also for some incredibly enthusiastic support from the stands! It was a wonderful and unforgettable experience and many thanks go to Mr Marland for organising the trip.

Garden Party - Saturday 12th May

This is an event on behalf of the National Garden Scheme, a charity that supports several good causes. The school grounds and gardens will be open for viewing from 1400 to 1700 as well as some private areas within the school estate. There are a variety of trails and walks, including the historic ice house in the garden of Field House, a woodland walk recently created by the Bushcraft Club and the newly restored boating lake. Year 3 gardeners will have a chance to plant up their gardens with parental (or grandparental) help. Bedding plants and vegetables may be brought in from home or purchased at the plant stall. The entry charge is $\pounds 5$ per adult, children free. Teas and a selection of plants will be on sale. Live music will be played during the afternoon with members of a professional brass group (the Hall Grove Concert Band should arrive at 1345 and the players can be collected from 1530). This is always a lovely event, do please support it.

Scarlet Fever

There has been a suspected case of Scarlet Fever in Pre-Prep. Scarlet Fever often follows a sore throat. Further symptoms include a red flushed face, feeling generally unwell, swollen glands and a rash which may be itchy. Although it is very contagious, cases are usually mild and can be treated with antibiotics. Children should be kept off school until they have had their first 24 hours of antibiotics.

Our second speaker is David Fettes, a professional wildlife photographer with a highly infectious enthusiasm for his work which takes him all over the world. I have been fortunate enough to see some of his photos myself – they are of the highest quality and I am really looking forward to seeing them projected on our big screen in the New Hall. He will be bringing a scientific slant to his talk and will touch on everything from biodiversity and endangered species to the physical science behind the photographic process. His talk is from 1400-1530 on Friday 11th May in New Hall to Middle School and Upper School. Please try to come along – I can assure you of an entertaining afternoon."
