## Choosing a Senior School

It can be an anxious time for parents when they begin the process of considering options beyond Hall Grove. Advice is given at the parents' evenings, and through the year we organise some special talks to introduce parents to some of the many alternatives that they may not have considered. As a start, parents of boys may like to hear about the entry requirements for Eton College, one of our nearest public schools, on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> September at 1900. The master in charge of admissions will attend, Charles Milne, together with a current senior Eton pupil and Hall Grove Old Boy, James Richardson. On Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> September at 1900 we are holding a special evening for girls' senior schools which parents of girls are most welcome to attend. On Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> November we are hosting a Senior Schools' Fair at which a dozen or so schools will exhibit. Parents are also reminded that the Headmaster is always happy to meet them individually to advise on school choices.

#### **School Drive**

A number of additional lessons are being taught in the newly refurbished Science and Technology Workshop (formerly the Carpentry Workshop) located at the top of the drive opposite the Uniform Shop and TASC. We ask that parents and all other drivers abide by the 10 mph speed limit and that they are particularly vigilant when approaching all marked crossings.

#### **After School Clubs**

After School Clubs information was sent out this week. Club lists are in the process of being finalised and parents will be notified if a requested place is not available due to a particular club being over-subscribed. The clubs start on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> September and run until Friday 14<sup>th</sup> December.

The evenings will begin with an informal social gathering in the garden alongside New Hall over drinks (indoors if wet). Parents should not bring children to school for the meetings. Individual parent-teacher consultations have been arranged for later in the Autumn term.

## Music Department

#### Instrumental Lessons

Some instrumental teaching has commenced already and most other lessons are beginning next week. Timetables are displayed on the Music noticeboard in the corridor beyond Matron's Room. There has been an immense number of requests for lessons so if you have not yet heard from either Mrs Salmond Smith or your child's instrumental teacher, please be patient. There has been particular interest in the piano and some children have been placed on a waiting list for the time being. There are still limited spaces for some other instruments; please contact Mrs Salmond Smith for further details. With over 200 instrumental lessons taking place in the school each week, and not forgetting those who learn outside of school, this is set to be another very musical year for Hall Grove!

#### Choirs

We have a number of choirs at the school, each of which has a different character. Hall Grove Choir is open to anyone who wishes to sing and rehearsals are held on Wednesday mornings at 0800. Girls' Choir is held on Thursdays at 1245. We are also hoping to run a Senior Girls' Choir for those in Years 6 - 8 if there is sufficient interest, and this would be held on Mondays. Your child should tell Mrs Salmond Smith or Mr Heffer if they wish to join any of these three choirs. Entry to Choristers is strictly by audition only. Last year's Choristers will automatically remain in the choir without needing to audition again; however, if your child wishes to leave Choristers for any reason, please let Mrs Salmond Smith know as soon as possible so that another child can take his/her place. The structure of Choristers will be changing slightly this year: the current limit of 30 children can be restrictive both in terms of availability for outside performances, but also in the sense that it limits the number of talented singers in the school who have the opportunity to participate. In order to address these challenges, the number of Choristers will be increasing to 40 with the newer recruits being considered 'probationers'. These Choristers may not perform in every single event during the year, but they will learn the same repertoire and be called upon for a selection of performances both in school and outside. Once they have completed their probationary year, they will become full Choristers. Rehearsals are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at 0800. We already have a variety of high-profile performances scheduled this year including Evensong at Salisbury Cathedral, The Children's Trust Concert at St. John's, Smith Square, and our annual live broadcast of the Daily Service for Radio Four. Prospective Choristers should see Mrs Salmond Smith for an audition.

#### Ensembles

Please be reminded that if your child learns an instrument outside of school, they are more than welcome to play in one of our ensembles. A full schedule is available on the noticeboard outside the Clanwilliam Room and most ensembles, including choirs, are due to commence from Monday.
