Hall Grove Poetry Competition 2013

The final for our Poetry Competition this year will be held on Wednesday 27th March at 0830 (please note the amended time) in New Hall. Over the next few weeks we encourage all children from Years 3 to 8 to learn a poem which they will perform in one of their lessons before their class/set. The very best from each group will go forward to the final. This year teachers will be giving suggestions for poems, but children will also be able to propose their own choices. Slapped Cheek

There has been a case of 'Slapped Cheek' Syndrome in Pre-Prep. This is a viral infection which presents with a rash, often on a child's face, but may spread to the body. The rash can be accompanied by a fever. For most children, the infection is usually a mild illness, which passes quickly without the need for treatment, other than paracetamol to bring a fever down and antihistamines to reduce itching. There is no requirement for a child to miss school, unless they are feeling unwell.
