This scholarship follows a major Music scholarship won by Adam earlier this term. Yousuf Mirza and Harry Francis are to be congratulated for being awarded places at RGS and finishing in good positions on the entrance lists. It has been a most successful year for scholarships and the Year 8 pupils are achieving very well indeed.

Online Concerns with Year 6

A number of parents have raised significant concerns regarding the nature of communication between some children using various electronic means, for example on iPads and mobile phones, in the evenings and at weekends. The children have been spoken to quite firmly by the Headmaster, who pointed out that any electronic correspondence can always be traced back to an individual and that what begins as some thoughtless name-calling can soon become very serious and extremely hurtful to those on the receiving end. We are aware that some of the language has been totally inappropriate for children of this age and would ask parents to monitor their child's on-line activity closely and raise any concerns with the School.

Year 6 Poetry Evening

The boys and girls of Year 6 are to be congratulated for an excellent evening reciting poems to their parents. There are some talented pupils in this year group and they can be proud of their performances.

Year 5 Design Challenge

Cricket Kit

Years 4 to 8 may bring cricket bats into school next term (please make sure bats are clearly named). They will be stored as directed by the games staff. **Children are allowed to bring in cricket bags on match days only**. Please be aware that the school supplies all necessary cricket equipment so there is nothing that a child will need that is not provided; however, they may use their own kit on match days if they wish. Years 2 and 3 will not be required to bring bats or kit at any point during the term.

Buying the Right Cricket Bat

Cricket bats can be expensive items and the wrong weight choice can actually mean that your child's batting regresses rather than improves over the season. If you are buying a bat over the holidays, please make sure that you are confident that any advice you are given is sound. As we all know, the quality of in-store advice from the larger sports chain stores can vary enormously. If in doubt, wait until the start of the season and consult one of several well-qualified cricket coaches that we are lucky to have on the staff here at Hall Grove.

The children will be swimming as part of the sports programme in the Summer term. All children in Years 3 to 8 must have a Hall Grove swimming costume (see uniform list).
