The excitement is building towards the end of term and the children are busy with a huge range of activities. Today's visit to Gifford's Circus was a huge success; staff and children thoroughly enjoyed it. Parents are asked to take careful note of the timings for the Shakespeare Evening next Friday.

Pre-Prep children go home at the normal time, they may return with their parents later in the evening if they would like to do so. Middle and Upper School children will stay on at school. The evening will close at 1930, in good time for the Year 6 party organised by parents outside school.

Most of the activities will take place near the Coach House and by the cabins. The short open air performance of Macbeth will be at 1845. There will be a hog roast (tickets available on the night or bought before). Do please support this evening of fun and theatre, and enjoy Shakespeare as he has never been seen before!
