Hall Grove All-Rounder Senior Scholarships

Year 6 Parents are reminded that we now offer All-Rounder Scholarships to help boys and girls complete Years 7 and 8 at Hall Grove. Up to six of these awards are available, worth up to 25% of school fees each term for which the award is held subject to continuing good conduct of the candidate. Criteria: pupils are required to demonstrate that they are able to make a strong all-round contribution to the school's cultural, sporting or academic life. Qualities of good citizenship and leadership are required. Holding such an award will be evidence to a senior school that the pupil is very highly regarded. Applications are to be received by Monday 3rd February 2014. All applications must be supported by an independent reference and a letter of recommendation.
