As November turns into December we can anticipate a range of Christmas events in the last two weeks of term. We also turn our mind to the Hall Grove Christmas Charity Collection. This year the School Council (made up of representative pupils) has voted to support the work of the Royal Marsden Cancer Hospital, the Surrey Wildlife Trust and Save the Children. Parents and grandparents of the pupils performing are most welcome to come along. On Tuesday evening, the children should return to school in costume at 1840 and be taken to their classrooms. After the performance, they will be taken back to their classrooms for collection.

## Reception and Year 1 Nativity - Thursday 12th December

The Reception and Year 1 Nativity is taking place on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December at 1800 in New Hall. It should last approximately forty minutes. Parents and grandparents of the pupils performing are most welcome to come along. On Thursday evening, the children should return to school at 1730 and be dropped off at their classrooms, where staff will help them change into their costumes. After the performance, the children will be taken back to their classrooms for collection. Please do not take them directly from the hall.

## Years 4 and 5 Christmas Concert - Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December

On Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December all pupils in Years 4 and 5 will be taking part in their Christmas Concert in New Hall. The concert will start at 1900 and should last approximately one hour. The drive will be closed and parking will be on the playing fields.

The end of this term is full of excitement for all the children, but we should remember that Christmas is above all a family time and we do not wish to stretch the build up to a full month beforehand. With this in mind, it helps if Christmas cards are not swapped in school until the last full week of term when we have a special system for collecting, sorting and delivering them. Please remember that presents are not to be given between children at school, and sweets, cakes and other food should not be brought in either for personal consumption or for general distribution.
