PLEASE HELP US TO GIVE GIRLS AN EDUCATION

We would like to ask you all for your help. We know that our education means that we have a world of opportunities ahead of us and that it will give us the chance to choose what we do with our lives. The kidnapping of the schoolgirls in Nigeria has made us realise that, in some developing countries, many girls do not have this choice. They are not allowed to have an education and many are treated like possessions – in fact, 42% of the girls in the developing world are not enrolled in school. Before we leave Hall Grove we would like to make a difference. Some organisations are helping girls in developing countries to get an education. One such organisation doing amazing work in this area is Room to Read. It costs £160 to send one girl to school for one year so we would like to raise enough money to send 10 girls to school for one year. We will be running a sponsored quiz and we would like to involve the whole school. There will be different quizzes for different age groups with book token prizes for each group. But this is not a test – the aim is to raise sponsorship for doing the bumper quiz and the biggest prize is for the person who raises the most money. Quizzes and sponsorship forms have been sent home today for families to tackle over the weekend – quiz entries and sponsorship money must be returned to the school office by 1700 on Wednesday, 18th June. Please take part in the quiz, have fun and help us send more girls to school.
