#### Girls' Games

All the senior girls played in a fixture with St Mary's Ascot on Tuesday and we had some encouraging results with 2 draws and 1 win. On Wednesday the senior girls travelled to Cranleigh Prep School; despite the wet afternoon the seniors had another tough fixture and again they coped admirably, always working hard and looking for ways to improve their game with focus and speed - they have had a tremendous five weeks of hockey under the guidance of Mr Marland. Emily Thorne was particularly good for the 1st VII as their goal keeper making some outstanding saves. The 2nd VII worked tirelessly with both Emily Myers making some hard tackles and Grace Millar making some fearless saves.

We hosted some small schools hockey tournaments this week to give the girls some much needed tournament exposure. As a preparatory school we feel it is vital that as many girls as possible get the exposure of different competitions and we are delighted that eight of our girls' hockey teams had the opportunity to play against different schools on both Wednesday and Thursday.
