#### Cricket and Rounders Easter Camp - FULL

#### IAPS JUDO

Well done to all the boys who competed at the IAPS Judo in High Wycombe. They all acquitted themselves well and should be proud of their efforts. Henry Sturm was crowned IAPS Champion and won gold in the U30kg category. His opponent in the final was none other than James Crane, who fought very bravely and won silver. Thomas Morley and Max Tenenbaum both won Bronze medals in the U38kg category. Well done to all the boys as this meant that Hall Grove came second in the team event, beaten by Bishopsgate by one point!

#### **IAPS Cross Country**

Mr Tullett took a group of athletes to the IAPS National Cross Country Championships at Malvern College on a very misty Sunday morning. Following intensive early morning training sessions and hard work in PE and Games lessons he was confident of Hall Grove's chances. There were over 1200 athletes running in the four age groups and eighty-one schools competing. The U13 boys and girls teams competed well with the most notable performance in these two races coming from Danny Wessely, the team captain in the boys' race, and Antonia Gathy in the girls' race. The U11 boys ran well with Adam Humpish bringing the team home and certainly showing promise for the future. The outstanding performance of the day was Nathalie Camp's victory in the U11 girls' race. She showed great maturity and tactical awareness to dominate the race from start to finish. Not only did Hall Grove have its first National Cross Country Champion on this day, we also won a bronze medal in the team event. Nathalie was backed up by her deputies, Ellie Monk, Rosie Millar and Sarah Vandenberg, who were well placed in the race to achieve their thoroughly well deserved medal.

Marcus Sands holds the distinction of being the first Hall Grove pupil to compete in a fencing match. He went to Woodcote House on Monday evening and performed really well, finishing in third place out of fifteen competitors in an individual competition. Well done Marcus!

#### IAPS U11 National Netball Finals

Ten U11 netballers along with their coaches travelled to Brighton last Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> March to participate in the very prestigious National netball finals, a huge competition in the netball calendar - the girls had worked incredibly hard to earn their place at the event. A very tough draw meant it was going to be a challenging day and the girls worked together to ensure the team put out their best performance on the day. Led by Captain Yasmin van der Zijl the defence were awesome, together with Carmen Schellekens and Victoria Fearnhead the girls worked tirelessly. Mid court was made up of the very fast Beatrice Brockman, Nathalie Camp, Jessica Gunning and Ellie Monk. All the girls took to the court at some point during the day and showed terrific maturity when switched on and off; finally the shooting trio who had practised relentlessly, Gabriella Brinn-Johnson, Pippa Marlow and Vice-Captain India Underwood, completed this talented squad. The girls played 8 matches and won 5, and were placed a very credible 4<sup>th</sup> in their pool. The experience and memories they took from the day will hopefully be the building blocks of their senior sporting careers. We are excited by the prospect of what the future will bring with such a strong sporting group of girls.

At the other end of the spectrum the next generation of netball players, our talented U8s competed in a netball tournament at St George's Weybridge. The girls won 5 and drew 1 of their 6 matches which placed them 2<sup>nd</sup> on goal difference. Captain Abby Parker was delighted to be awarded silver medals for the team and our top defender Amelie Lomas was voted the girl of the tournament. This team have progressed so much over the season and should be very proud of their efforts.

Our final afternoon of Spring fixtures was an exciting mix of netball and lacrosse with all of the girls involved in matches. We took two teams to play at the Lambrook lacrosse tournament where the seniors won two matches, drew

one and lost two. They were placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall and Minnie Anderson displayed some amazing attacking skills to keep the opposition on their toes. Meanwhile Hall Grove hosted an U10 lacrosse festival with Crosfield and Edgeborough bringing along their Year 5 players. What a sight to behold in the Spring sunshine with so many enthusiastic players participating in this fast and furious sport!

The U12 and U11 netball teams went off to play Eagle House's U13 A and B teams! This challenging fixture allowed the girls to be stretched and they met the challenge head-on, with the U12s narrowly losing to a versatile A team and the U11s beating Eagle House U13 B team convincingly 21-7. There was some solid play from the girls and a great way to finish the season.

The U11 B and C netball teams were invited to play in the Hoe Bridge B and C tournament and our two teams played well but the heroes of the afternoon were the C team led by Maisie Payne who put in the performance of a lifetime. They won 4 and drew 1 match which put them top of their pool. They beat St Hillary's in the semi-final and went on to play Guildford High School in the nail-biting final; the match went goal for goal taking the game to golden goal (sudden death). Darcy Atherton won the vital toss up and the ball was transported to goal with incredible speed via Cristina Brown, to Camilla Lawson and then straight to Jeeya Obhrai who scored the winning goal with a swish! A tremendous effort with the team being completed by the defence who were made up of Navlleen Grewal and two Year 5 girls Billie Deighton and Catherine Clarke. Careful and precise with the ball, tenacious and hard working throughout, the girls were undoubtedly the best team in the tournament and were a real credit to the school.

We had a wonderful afternoon on Thursday with all the girls playing in lacrosse festivals. The Under 9s fielded three mixed ability teams for the friendly triangular hosted by Edgeborough. All three teams played some spirited lacrosse and achieved a win and a defeat each. Some of the stars of the afternoon were Yun Yun Lai, Matilda and Gisella Bernabo, Isabella Birkett-Eyles, Nerys Tullett and Sophia Bandosz. We hosted an U8 festival at Hall Grove with 9 teams participating which meant a busy afternoon for the girls being able to put their freshly learned skills into action. Lola Thunder-Rogers, Fleur Gilbert and Amelie Lomas all scored some fabulous goals.

#### Boys' Games

On a gorgeous Saturday morning, the boys played Moulsford in a series of fixtures. All the games were competitive and the boys should be really proud of how they played. The Under 10s drew both their games, the Colts won and drew a game with the senior teams winning two and drawing two. All games were very even and brilliant to watch. #### Surrey Schools Swimming Gala
