Girls' Games

Yet another busy week for the girls, starting with some weekend rounders and cricket fixtures for the senior girls. The U11 A team travelled to Hawthornes School on the South Downs to participate in a rounders tournament with over 16 schools involved. Although there were some terrific individual performances it was the team spirit that won the day for the girls, the support and energy they gave each other was incredible and 4 out of 6 wins put the girls into the semi-final against The Study – and what a semi-final it was! Our fielding was incredible and The Study managed to score only 1 rounder off 18 balls; Mrs Maxfield was confident that the team could beat that target, however The Study had other ideas and *their* fielding was equally impressive. The match was tied 1 - 1, the decider would be on number of players "out" 6-6, and a tie break would have to be played. With nine good balls and everything to play for, the excitement was intense. The Study scored 3 and we had to strike the ball well to beat that. With all to play for the girls risked everything and won by $\frac{1}{2}$ a rounder, and a place in the final against Hoe Bridge beckoned. As usual a well drilled and ruthless team out-performed Hall Grove and we had to settle for Silver medals. The winner of the day was most definitely the team spirit of the nine team members who supported one another on and off the field – well done to them all. Special congratulations to Jessica Gunning, Yasmin van der Zijl and Jemima McKechnie who were awarded school colours for their outstanding contribution to U11 rounders.

The senior girls have continued to enjoy cricket coaching in their games lessons and on Saturday Mr Lewis took the girls to a cricket festival at Lord Wandsworth. They played with confidence and enjoyed being tested by schools that play regular fixtures. We had 3 matches, our results were very creditable with 1 win, 1 loss and 1 draw; Katie Walker had two outstanding innings as a batter and Abby Mayhew was a steady and reliable bowler.

On Wednesday we took some of our top senior girl athletes to The West Surrey Athletics in Guildford and despite the rain all the girls that participated put in accomplished performances. However, without exception, the athlete of the day was Nathalie Camp who not only won the 1500m by at least 50m, she qualified for The National Finals AND smashed the regional record by 6 seconds. Nathalie was awarded junior athletics colours and invited to ring the Jubilee Bell in assembly.

We had a block of rounders fixtures against Eagle House on Wednesday and played some extremely competitive matches, losing some by just 1 rounder. The most exciting match of the day was the U11 A team's – Annabel Hatten was strong at backstop, Gracie Hessian an excellent captain, Darcy Atherton a strong fielder and Olivia Llewellyn-Jones scored 4 rounders. The U10s should be commended for their great attitude with Catherine Clarke being voted players' player for her batting and fielding, Scarlett Young for her steady and consistent bowling and Billie Deighton for her batting.
