# Arrangements for the First Day of Term: Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September

The beginning of term can be rather hectic on the drive and turning circle, with a lot of new parents who do not know the routine of 'turn and drop'. We are also aware that it can be a confusing and anxious time for new pupils in particular. With this in mind, please study these arrangements carefully.

Pre-School and Reception children should be taken to The Barn between 0815 - 1000. Formal activities will start around 1000 on that morning so if you want to do a later drop off and settle in you are welcome to do so. Pre-School and Reception parents will wish to park their cars on the playing fields / tennis courts and walk their children into school, but other parents are asked to turn and drop in the normal way. Children who come earlier (shared lifts etc.) may go directly to their classrooms, but parents should not park on the drive. There will be staff on hand at the archway to offer directions for the classrooms.

Years 1 and 2 children should arrive at the usual time of 0830 (see 'The School Day').

Middle School (Years 3 - 5) and Upper School (Years 6 - 8) children should be dropped off, if possible, between 0830 and 0900 and they should make their way directly to classrooms. Assembly will be at 1000 so there will be plenty of time to arrive and settle without distress.

Parents of new children in Years 3 - 8 may, if they so wish, return to school for the first Assembly of the term at 1000 in New Hall. Please enter by the main doorway beyond the Coach House. There will be coffee with some of the staff afterwards.

## **School Uniform**

Winter uniform is to be worn from the start of term. (If it is warm weather children will be advised not to wear ties or jumpers). Uniform must be smart in appearance at all times – please be aware that you will be asked to replace items if this is not the case. All school uniform and kit must be clearly labelled with your child's name.

## **Boys' Trousers**

Please ensure that Years 7 and 8 boys wear the grey trousers as specified in the clothing list. Alternative shades of grey are not permitted.

# Watches

Please note that only children in Years 7 and 8 may wear a watch, together with those in Years 3 - 6 who have an individual music lesson with a peripatetic teacher on that day. As children change for games / PE daily, this measure is to prevent the upset of loss. Pre-Prep children are not expected to have watches in school.

# Girls' Earrings, other Jewellery, Makeup and Hair

Girls with pierced ears are only allowed to wear small gold/silver studs to school and they must be able to take them out for Games and PE. No bracelets or wrist bands should be worn without the express permission of the Headmaster. No makeup or nail varnish should be worn at any time. Hair should be tied back if it reaches the shoulder using hairbands available from the school uniform shop.

# The School Day

### Normal Starting Times

Breakfast (0730) must be booked through the Boarding House via email (a.tutt@hallgrove.co.uk), or by phoning or emailing the School Office (office@hallgrove.co.uk). The charge for breakfast is  $\pounds 6$  and will be added to your school bill.

Choristers (selected by audition) and other music group rehearsals start at 0800. Early morning group music sessions will begin no earlier than the second week of term.

Children may arrive from 0815.

Children in Years 1 - 8 must be registered by 0830.

Reception and Pre-School children should be in The Barn by 0900.

Before 0830 we operate a 'turn and drop' system as there is very limited car parking available. Younger children in the Pre-Prep who may need walking into school should therefore be brought in after 0830 until they are confident enough to go to their classes unaided.

Clubs generally finish at 1630 (Reception - Year 2), 1730 (Middle School) and 1830 (Upper School) with a few exceptions.

Early arrival for collection should be avoided because it blocks the pick-up area for everyone else. If you are collecting two or more children within any of the above sections (i.e. Reception – Year 2, Years 3 – 5, Years 6 – 8), you may find it easier to collect at the later time. **Please do not wait on the turning circle between pick-up times.** 

# The Drive

To ensure a safe and efficient drop-off and pick-up, we require everyone to be considerate and remember that one person not complying with our procedure causes a large number of people considerable frustration. Please remember the following and inform anyone dropping off or collecting your child:

- In the mornings, it is important to observe the 'turn and drop' system, and in the afternoon please 'turn and collect'.
- If you need to park, please use the tennis court area (available until 0855 only).
- Use the crossings with your children do not dash across the drive.
- Older children may be encouraged to walk down the drive in the mornings, using the pathway and crossings.
- Assist the flow of traffic by arriving at school no earlier than the designated pick-up times.
- Cars should **never** park on the yellow lines or roundabout.

**NB** Year 6 pick-up is from the shelters beside the Tennis Courts and children will be walked there for collection.

We are aware that the afternoon and evening collections can cause a great deal of frustration. Parents are asked, please, to assist by arriving no earlier than the published collection time and to be patient. We are not alone as a school in having pressure points in traffic and our arrangements are very much better than many others!

## TASC

The Time After School Care (TASC) will operate for pupils in Pre-School to Year 4 from the first day of term, running from 1530 to 1800. This offers children a programme of both indoor and outdoor activities. As part of the provision fruit and fruit-based snack bars will be provided. TASC sessions can be booked, in advance, through the 360 Sports Education on 01252 918888. The charge for TASC is  $\pounds 8$  per hour.

## Twilight

Twilight is available to children in Years 5 to 8 from the end of their school day until 1745. This is primarily for supervised prep, rather than play activities, and is also there for those parents who need some occasional after-school care. The charge for Twilight will be  $\pounds$ 4 per half-hour. Where there will be a regular booking, or when advance notice can be given, children should be booked in for sessions through the School Office. Twilight is for children wanting to work on prep and for quiet reading – it is not intended as a long-term childcare solution and those in Year 5 or below who want supervised play or 'winding-down' time should be booked into our clubs programme.

## After School Clubs

Further information for the Autumn Term After School Clubs will be sent out via email for on-line bookings within the next week. Club times are 1530 to 1630 for Pre-Prep, 1630 to 1730 for Middle School and 1730 to 1830 for most Years 6 to 8 clubs although one or two Upper School clubs might start or finish at a later time. Clubs begin in the week commencing Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September.

## Supper and Boarding

Supper is available to children in Years 3 to 8 on Monday to Thursday, inclusive, and is served in the Dining Hall from 1830 to 1900. Places must be booked with Mrs Tutt (a.tutt@hallgrove.co.uk) and copied to the School Office (office@hallgrove.co.uk). Children will need to be booked in for TASC or Twilight beforehand. The charge for supper is  $\pounds$ 15 and will be added to your school bill.

Children in Years 3 to 8 can be booked in to board on Mondays to Thursdays, inclusive, during term-time. There are a limited number of places available for flexi-boarders and, where possible, we prefer children to have a minimum of two consecutive boarding nights a week booked on a regular basis. Boarding at Hall Grove gives a good introduction to senior school life and is very popular. For bookings and enquiries please contact Mrs Tutt.

## Weekly Newsletters

The weekly newsletter is sent out by email to all parents via the ClarionCall service. Any additional documents or letters will be attached to the newsletter email, posted on the school website with links or will be sent out separately by email. A few copies of the most current newsletters are held in the School Office for collection should you require a paper copy. In addition, on Fridays, a link to that week's newsletter will be posted on the school website home page.

# Autumn Term 2016 School Calendar

A provisional copy of the Autumn Term 2016 School Calendar is available on the School website. Please note the weekend commitments. Parents are reminded that all boys and girls are expected to be available on some Saturdays for whole year group training sessions, house matches and weekend matches.

# School Dates for 2017

The Leadership Team has reviewed the published provisional dates for next year and has taken account of the views of many families who have, in recent terms, requested additional leave for school holidays in order to take advantage of cheap flights. We have therefore decided that we should, whenever possible, start term on a Monday and finish on a Friday. Authorisation for additional holidays will only be given in very exceptional circumstances. The Spring Term will now finish on Friday March 24<sup>th</sup> (full school day) and the Summer Term on Friday July 7<sup>th</sup>. The spare days will be used by staff for meetings, preparations and, where needed, some individually arranged extra tuition for examination candidates.

Parents can redeem the value of childcare vouchers against the cost of Twilight, flexi-boarding and school clubs (please note you are unable to use them through the school for clubs that are run by outside sources).

## **Sports Team Information**

Once teams have been selected, team sheets are posted on the school website, where you can find a map for directions, and on the fixtures noticeboard under the archway. The sheets for Wednesday and Thursday fixtures will be published by the end of the school day on Mondays/Tuesdays and Saturday fixture information will be available from the end of the school day on Thursdays. Team sheets also include departure times for weekend matches. Parents are welcome to attend all matches to support their children. The school calendar informs you of forthcoming fixtures for the term ahead. Please be aware that Year 3 matches are listed as U8, Year 4 as U9, Year 5 as U10, Year 6 as U11 or Colts and Years 7 and 8 as U12 and U13 or 1<sup>st</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> teams. **Please call 01276 470009 if your child is unable to attend a match.** 

## Instrumental Lessons

Parents keen for their children to start individual music lessons should write to the Director of Music, Mr Waltho (j.waltho@hallgrove.co.uk), or our Music Administrator, Miss Lizzie Post (l.post@hallgrove.co.uk). We will be delighted to advise and arrange lessons for any pupils wishing to take advantage of this opportunity. We currently offer lessons in voice, recorders, flute, clarinet, saxophone, piano, organ, trumpet, cornet, trombone, tuba, violin, viola, 'cello, ukulele, guitar (classical and electric), drums and percussion, with 12 visiting instrumental teachers. If parents have queries on this, or wish to explore the possibility of their children learning other instruments, please contact Mr Waltho. Wherever possible we will encourage the children to join instrumental ensembles to aid their musical development.

We also offer supervised 30 minute instrumental practice sessions after school for children in Years 3 – 8. These will begin the week beginning Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September, the same week as our after-school clubs. Please contact Miss Post for further information.

## **School Service Books**

All new children in Years 3 – 8 will be issued with a Service Book, which has its own individual bookplate – it is something to treasure and keep beyond Hall Grove. Please name it neatly, take care of it and keep in school.

## Mouthguards

Children in Years 4 - 8 need a mouthguard for hockey and rugby. It is preferable that children return to school with a mouthguard, alternatively the OPRO service is available, but this will mean that mouthguards will not be available in time for the first girls' hockey matches which start right at the beginning of term.

OPRO, the dental organisation that specialises in mouthguards, will be visiting the school on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September for girls' and boys' mouthguard fittings. To order a mouthguard please visit: http://mouthguards.opro.com/custom/order Boys in Years 4 - 8 will need a mouthguard from the middle of September, once the OPRO mouthguards have arrived.

## **General Notes**

### Absence

It is important to notify the School Office if your child is absent from school. In the event of illness, parents should notify the School Office by telephone on 01276 473059 or by email to office@hallgrove.co.uk on the morning of the absence. This is a legal requirement. Prior written notice of absence due to medical appointments, music exams etc., should be sent to the School Office. School absence for family events and holidays will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances and must be on a form written request addressed to Mr Graham.

### Late Arrival

If your child arrives at school after registration at 0830, please ensure that he/she goes straight to the School Office to be registered as present.

### Sickness

If your child is unwell during the night, i.e. sickness, diarrhoea etc., please allow 48 hours to elapse before you send him/her back to school.

### Medical Details and Medication

Please remember to inform the School of any changes to the medical information we currently hold for your child. Medication from home (e.g. antibiotics) may only be administered if requested by the parent/guardian in writing with instructions using the 'Parent Consent for Prescribed Medication' form available on the School website ('Parents / Medical / Parental Consent for Prescribed Medication'). These are also available from the School Office or from the School Nurses. All medication should be clearly labelled, with the dispensing label if prescribed by a doctor. Please note that decanted medicines will not be accepted. Asthma inhalers and Adrenaline pens should be brought to school at the start of term and given to the School Office together with written instructions for use. Please ensure that all medication is named and in date.

#### Head Lice

Please check your child's hair for head lice before he/she returns to school and continue to check on a regular basis. If it becomes necessary to treat your child during term-time, please notify the school. Advice regarding treatment can be obtained from your local pharmacist.

#### Lost Property

Please ensure all your child's possessions are named clearly and securely, including all footwear. There is a significant amount of lost property which cannot be returned as it is unnamed. If items of uniform are secondhand, please remember to remove the old name tapes and replace with your child's own name.

## School Security - Visitors

Please note that all visitors to the school, outside normal drop-off and collection times, are required to report to the School Office – this includes all parents. Unless otherwise directed, all access to the buildings during the school day will be via the front door, where you must report to the School Office to be signed in. If for any reason your child needs to be collected before the end of the school day, please come to the School Office where he/she will be brought to meet you and will be signed out.

The school grounds are not available for parents and families to use for exercise or recreation other than by arrangement. Dogs are not permitted on the fields.

## **Reminder: Prize Giving Cups and Awards**

If your child was presented with a cup at Prize Giving, please could you have the cup engraved in the same format as the previous winner and return it to the School Office. Thank you.
