## Hand, foot and mouth disease

We had a very busy Saturday with the U10 B team participating in Downsend's annual B hockey tournament. We played 3 matches, winning two and losing just one to a very strong St George's Weybridge. A super end to the hockey season – well done to all who participated.

In the afternoon we took the 1<sup>st</sup> VII and U12 teams to a netball tournament at St Mary's Ascot; both teams did exceptionally well. The U12s played 6, of which they won 5. The 1<sup>st</sup> VII did even better winning all 7 of their matches, scoring over 50 goals throughout the afternoon and conceding just 5.

On Wednesday the 1st VII and U12 A team continued their 100% win ratio with two very convincing wins against Feltonfleet. The Year 8s have shown real progress in their time at the school and I hope that this year has given the Year 7s the learning experience required to step up as senior players next year. Well done boys!

We have seen a marked improvement in all teams and all coaches have been very impressed in games lessons when focusing on defence and defensive realignment.

On Thursday afternoon we played Hoe Bridge. All U9 boys have really worked hard on defence and tackle technique. There was a visible improvement in their willingness and confidence to make tackles. With four very close matches, special mentions must go to the U9 B, C and D teams who tried to always keep the ball alive in attack and support the ball carrier. The U9 A team have really impressed when it comes to taking on the other team and forcing them backwards. This has been led by Joseph Turner who really does put his body on the line whenever tackling. A really pleasing and promising week of rugby fixtures, underpinned by hard work and dedication. Well done to all involved.
