We played Pangbourne first in a 20 minute match, with all boys performing extremely well and running out convincing winners by 7 tries to 1; arguably one of the most complete team performances this season. Then they moved on to their second 20 minute match against Reddam House. This proved to be a very even contest and the match was played at a very fast pace, with all boys showing how far they have come on this season. Luca Allera scored a brilliant try, showing a good eye for space and solid decision-making to dart over for the try.
