Application for Authorised Absence Reminder

Earlier in the year the Leadership Team reviewed the published provisional dates for this academic year and considered the views of many families who have, in recent terms, requested additional leave for school holidays in order to take advantage of cheap flights. We decided that we should, whenever possible, start term on a Monday and finish on a Friday. **Authorisation for additional holidays will only be given in very exceptional circumstances**. The Spring Term will finish on Friday March 24th (full school day) and the Summer Term on Friday July 7th. As already announced, the spare days will be used by staff for meetings, preparations and, where needed, some individually arranged extra tuition for examination candidates.

Girls' Games

On Saturday we hosted our annual U11 B and C tournament; with over 100 girls participating it always gives the girls plenty of opportunity for them to get lots of match play. The U11 B team lost only one match and were placed 2^{nd} ; the U11 C team won 3, lost 3 and were placed 5^{th} . Congratulations to Tabitha Tonkin and Ella Hadden-Wight for being selected girls of the tournament.

The 1st and 2nds participated in the Cranleigh U13 tournament on Wednesday. The U13s played five matches, winning three and losing two both by just one goal. Sophie Lees in defence and Emily Myers were both reliable and versatile players. The U12s did exceptionally well, winning all five of their group matches. They had a tough semi-final match when they had to dig deep to win by just one goal. This took them to the final v Cranleigh - the girls excelled, working well as a team and supporting each other, and winning 7-3. Player of the tournament was Yasmin van der Zijl who was outstanding.

The U12 B team had a draw against Heathfield with Daniella Schellekens scoring all of Hall Grove's 8 goals.

The Year 5 and 6 girls played a block fixture against Guildford High, always a challenging fixture; despite the U11 A team suffering a loss there were many positives to take away and it is clear the extra training they are all very committed to is paying off, coaches' player of the match? "The whole team!" The B and C teams both had emphatic wins and played with determination; congratulations to players of the day – Grace Aldridge, Libby Lomas, Emily Wolfe and Ella Baxendale. The U10s suffered three losses, the Guildford High School girls seemed so much taller and more physical, however we never gave up and played with determination. Players of the afternoon were Amelie Smith, Katie Coleman and Isabella Volpi.

On Thursday the U9s enjoyed fixtures against Feltonfleet. We had six out of six wins with the junior girls scoring a total of forty four goals for Hall Grove and just ten goals against. Congratulations to the players selected as coaches' player: Nina van Eden, Mia Adams and Lola Roots for the Year 4 girls, Sophie Stroyberg, Luna Flo and Alice Sullivan for the Year 3 girls.

Boys' Games - End of Rugby Season Report

Monday saw the U9s host Bishopsgate in what proved to be a very even and fair contest with all boys looking to tackle, tackle, tackle and work hard with the ball in hand. Unfortunately they came out second best in all three matches but the boys performed very well and never stopped trying.

Tuesday saw the U9s take part in their second matches in two days; the work from the previous day was to pass the ball more before contact and work hard to form a defensive line. In four games the U9s managed to win one, draw two and lose one. Some standout performances came from Lewis Hannon and Oliver Townend who proved to be fearless with the ball in hand, and Lewis scored five tries.

The U13 A team travelled to Bishopsgate for a late arranged fixture. The boys took 15 minutes to wake up after a short journey on the minibus but really did finish the game well, going four tries to one down at half-time, to come out winning five tries to four. Man of the match Roan Macdonald led from the front, making a number of brilliant tackles and Charlie Wyatt scored the winning try on the last play, running sixty metres and showing brilliant footwork and evasive skills.

Wednesday saw the completion of the rugby season for Years 5 - 8 with a very good final fixture against Edgeborough, winning three out of five matches and putting together some of the best performances of the season. The U13 A team finished their rugby season with a strong performance against a very good Edgeborough side. Ethan Leech scored a powerful and direct try in what was a very open and fast game of rugby. The U12s finished the rugby season with a 35 - 25 win - Mr Hine was very impressed with how they stuck to structure and used the ball throughout the game.

The Colts have finished the season with two fine wins - Colts A finished the rugby season with a 10 - 5 victory, really grinding out a win when sometimes things didn't click with ball in hand, and Colts C ran out victors with 17 tries to 1. The U10 A team finished with their best performance of the season - they have really worked hard to improve over recent weeks and Wednesday's results saw all their hard work pay off. Unfortunately losing in the end four tries to two, Mr Tullett was still very impressed with the determination and hard work they have shown.

On Thursday the U8s continued their fine form, winning six matches and drawing four. Scoring over 50 tries and conceding only 25, this really does show the fine talent we have coming into contact rugby next year.
