Did you know that the Hawks are the most sociable house? or that the most popular food in Pre-Prep is ice cream and the most popular colour is blue?

The weather was our friend as Year 7 took to the athletics track, Year 5 trekked to the woodland and Year 6 left for Longacres. The entire school, from Pre-school to Year 8 were out in force on Tuesday for *Data Detective Day*, spending the entire day improving our data handling skills and following our curiosity, answering questions you never knew you had such as "How many habitats do we have at Hall Grove?", "Is there an equal spread of colours in a sweet packet?" and "What would a Hall Grove alien look like?". Countless charts were constructed. A gazillion graphs were generated. The Year 8s alone,
