## Weekly Review

What a week of Rugby! On Saturday afternoon the U13, U12 and U11 A's all went to Woodcote House for the annual fixture which traditionally has always been a tough match, and once again it did not disappoint. The U12 A's had a very exciting game losing 4 tries to 3. The score does not tell the whole story but the boys who played can be very proud of the way they fronted up and came back after being 4 - 1 down. The U11's had a good game, and we were delighted with their performance; they have improved immensely this season. The U13's had an incredibly physical game against a highly motivated Woodcote House. Our boys managed to weather the storm to secure a memorable victory.

On Tuesday evening, the U12 A team played in the Chobham Rugby Club floodlit schools' festival. They won 4 and drew 1, winning their group. Unfortunately there was not time to play the winners of the other group but the team did Hall Grove proud. Earlier in the day, the U9's and U8's played Papplewick. The U9's had three more victories and continue to grow as rugby players; the U8's won one, drew two and lost one in what was a very exciting and competitive afternoon.

Wednesday saw the U13 A team in action against Holme Grange and the U11's against Staines Prep. Hall Grove recorded victories in quite challenging weather. Thursday saw the U9's and U8's play against a competitive Staines Prep, but again the results went Hall Grove's way with some good wins.

Despite the horrendous weather conditions on Wednesday, the senior girls had a lovely afternoon at Lightwater Leisure Centre where they had a set of fixtures against opponents Danes Hill (Surrey). The girls played well and with three out of three wins they were deserved winners. On Thursday there was an exciting afternoon of netball as Hall Grove hosted its' annual U9 tournament. Guildford High, St George's Weybridge, Eagle House, The Marist and Yateley Manor all participated. Hall Grove A and B teams both won 4 matches and only lost to St George's. The C team lost one and drew one. The U8's played Guildford High; the A team drew 2-2 and B team lost. This is always a very competitive fixture, particularly when Guildford High have 48 girls to select from in Year 3!

## **Cross Country**

Well done to the girls who competed in the Danes Hill Cross Country relays last Friday. The teams competed well, but the stand out performance was from the U10 A team who finished 3rd in their event against 14 other teams. This Thursday the boys and girls went to the Sunningdale relays and came away with 2nd place in the senior and 3rd in the junior race. The U11 and U10 girls competed well in a boys' event and beat a couple of the boys' schools.
