

Parents will be aware that new EU regulations concerning the protection of personal data are being introduced from May 25th 2018. Known as the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the regulations will result in tighter controls to protect an individual's personal information and records.

The school takes its data handling responsibilities very seriously and is in the process of updating existing policies and procedures having undertaken a full data audit of our existing systems.

As part of this process, we will be issuing a Privacy Notice to inform the school community about the way in which we collect, store and use personal data, as well as explaining the rights of individuals. This will be subject to regular review in order to achieve and maintain full compliance with the new regulations.
