Breaking news: our Under 12 netballers are regional champions, having won all of their matches today and will compete in the National Finals next week. Congratulations!

An incredibly busy week of sport for the boys and girls. Netball, hockey, cross country and lacrosse teams have all been in action across the south of England. The major highlights include excellent performance of the U11 boys in the IAPS Regional Hockey finals. They scored an impressive 17 goals and conceded only 1. Unfortunately, they lost the semi-final to narrowly miss out on automatically qualifying for the National Finals.

Congratulations also to the U11 girls' netball team who won the plate competition at the IAPS regionals. After a slow start in the first couple of matches, they found their form and were unbeaten for the rest of a very long day.

The junior boys and girls were in action on Thursday along with the cross country squads. U8 girls had two wins in their netball matches against Feltonfleet and the U9 boys had two wins and two losses against Cranleigh. The cross country teams acquitted themselves well and a special mention to Emily Barnard and Lola Roots who finished 4<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> respectively in the Danes Hill event.

## Children's Use of Social Media

There has been a great deal of public attention on the Momo meme that children have been accessing, sometimes by mistake, and several parents have contacted the school to express their concern.

We have taken this advice from the BBC, and we have put a document on the school website which may be useful. Parents are urged to supervise very closely all on-line materials accessed by children.

**What should parents do?** Police have suggested that rather than focusing on the specific Momo meme, parents could use the opportunity to educate children about internet safety, as well as having an open conversation about what children are accessing.

This is merely a current, attention-grabbing example of the minefield that is online communication for kids," wrote the Police Service of Northern Ireland, in a Facebook post.

Broadcaster Andy Robertson, who creates videos online as Geek Dad, said in a podcast that parents should not "share warnings that perpetuate and mythologise the story".

"A better focus is good positive advice for children, setting up technology appropriately and taking an interest in their online interactions," he said.
