After School Care - Summer Term

From the beginning of the summer term we will restart our after-school provision prior to a full review for the autumn term. We shall take care to see that the programme is, as far as possible, Covid secure. We are not at this stage offering individual specialist clubs.

YEARS 5-8

From the beginning of the summer term, After School Care will be available for pupils in Years 5-8 in the form of two options:

OPTION ONE

1630-1800 (£15 per session). Collection from the Lighthouse before supper (children will be given a snack after school)

OPTION TWO

1630-1930 (£25 per session). Collection from the Lighthouse after supper (a cooked two course meal) and prep have been completed. Any cancellations will need to be received 24 hours in advance for catering purposes.

Both options include an evening activity and a light snack after school. It will not be possible to book a specific activity. Please note that charges are PER SESSION and not by time - children unable to be collected at the normal time MUST be collected at either 1800 or 1930, depending on which option has been booked. Any child not collected by 1630 (Years 5 and 6) or 1700 (Years 7 and 8) will automatically join After School Care provision and be charged accordingly.

Please reserve places at least a week in advance where possible.

PRE-SCHOOL to YEAR 4

From the beginning of the summer term, we are able to offer After School Care on a daily basis at the following times:

Early Years – 1530-1730 :(£20 per session). Collection from the Lighthouse at 1730, or with an older sibling at their collection time.

Pre-Prep (Years 1 and 2): 1530-1730 (£20 per session). Collection from the Lighthouse at 1730, or with an older sibling at their collection time.

Lower Juniors (Years 3 and 4): 1600-1730 £15 per session). Collection from the Lighthouse at 1730, or with an older sibling at their collection time.

Children will transfer to After School Care at the end of the school day and be given a drink and snack. Please note that charges are PER SESSION and not by time - children unable to be collected at normal time must be collected at 1730 from the Lighthouse. Any child not collected by the normal end of the school day will automatically join After School Care and be charged accordingly. Children will enjoy a range of activities both inside and out in the school grounds. It is not possible to book a specific activity.

Any child requiring supervision after 1730 is asked to contact the School Office so that they can be booked into Option 2 (details above in Years 5-8 section).
