Summer Programme

We are planning a repeat of the popular Summer School that we initiated post Lockdown last year. The idea is to give the pupils some additional time of structured classroom-based activities as well as plenty of outdoor fun. This will run from 12^{th} July -23^{rd} July.

Cost

Approx £,170 per week.

Timings

There will be a graduated drop off and collection system, which will be confirmed once numbers have been finalised. Approximate timings will be 0900 to 1530.

Activities

Each day will be split into morning and afternoon sessions; one indoors and the other outdoors. Children will be grouped in pods, the composition of which will be based on school year groups and sections. Examples of activities are listed below – this is not an exhaustive list, and the exact offering will differ according to age of a child's pod, but it gives an idea of the types of activities that will be offered:

Indoors: art, dance, board/card games, film, quiz, reading

Outdoors: gardening, low ropes course, mountain biking and bike agility, cricket, football, campfire cooking, bushcraft, minibeast hunts, plant identification, den building, tennis, wide games.

Pre-Prep children will be taking part in some age-appropriate activities building on team-work and problem-solving skills alongside some of the above tasks. Continuous provision will be provided for Early Years children as well as plenty of opportunities to use the Outdoor Classroom.

Please note that there will be no formal academic teaching. The staff will enable and support indoor and outdoor activities. We want the children to enjoy social interaction with their peers, within the organised and structured setting that Hall Grove offers.

Lunch

A full school lunch will be provided each day, as well as a mid-morning, and a mid-afternoon snack. Children are not to bring in additional food.
