Let's Keep it Going - A Covid Reminder

We are all benefitting from each step of the relaxation of the rules and the success of the vaccination programme. However, it remains just as important now as it was in the first days of the return to school last summer that we continue to follow our system of controls to protect the school community and ensure the school remains open to all pupils.

In particular, we must insist that you keep your child at home if they, or anyone else in the household, develop any one of the key Covid symptoms (high temperature, new persistent cough, or loss of or change to the sense of taste or smell). A PCR test should be obtained for the symptomatic individual. Any siblings should also remain away from school until the test result is received.
