From the Headmaster - Neil Tomlin OBE

Rather than report the many successes and activities of this week and the next, I would like to focus my introduction to this newsletter on one aspect of study throughout a large part of the school this week.

The racism scandal surrounding Yorkshire Country Cricket Club has been a topic of discussion as part of the Hall Grove Journey programme this week. This is not about cricket, although the lessons to be learnt will have a significant impact on the sport in this country. This is about prejudice and poor culture. This is about poor moral courage and the bystander effect. We believe that the discussions we have been able to have with many of our children over this last week have been essential for their development and learning.

Where you have the chance to continue these discussions at home, we will welcome your support. Many of our children should have a reasonable knowledge of this case and can combine this knowledge with their studies as part of anti-bullying week. Here is a link to the presentation from Monday's Assembly for Years 3-8. It might also be useful, as part of any discussion, to recognise the ability to apologise, as well as the value of an apology in addition to the importance of learning from mistakes.

At Hall Grove, we recognise that some will get things wrong, but we will educate the children to understand where and how they can get it right.

Whole School Messages

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Covid Contingency Plans

We are continuing to work hard to minimise so far as possible the levels of Covid in school. Our discussions with other local schools confirm our view that our rates relative to other schools are extremely low. We are grateful to parents for continuing to work with us to achieve this.

However, we are mindful that, as the winter progresses, the situation may worsen and, as required by government guidance, we have therefore considered the further steps which we may need to implement at a later time if we believe they would assist in reducing case numbers. These may include requiring Senior pupils to wear face masks in school, moving to daily LFD testing for Senior pupils, reinstating bubbles or requiring siblings of a confirmed positive case to remain at home. We will only bring in measures when needed and those which we believe will assist us in bringing case numbers down by targeting particular concerns relevant to our setting.
